



The New Year started with a bang at the Cooperative University of Kenya, where over 800 students gathered for the National Leadership and Mentorship Summit (NLMS). Despite it being in a festive season and the university's amphitheater was filled to capacity by youthful and vibrant leaders, including the CU leaders, Student Union Officials, Church Youth leaders, and even international leaders. The event marked the beginning of a new chapter in leadership for all who were present.

The plenaries, workshops, seminars, and interactive forums centered on the theme of value-based leadership for effective service. Delegates had unique opportunities to hear from experienced speakers, including former student leaders who have become influential figures in society. Based on the life of Samson, the presentations offered insightful perspectives on the current context of leadership and its challenges.

As observed from the life of Samson, external markers of successful leadership does not always mean transformational private lifestyles. In the words of the main expositor, Dr. Yaw Perbi, "God can use a crooked stick to draw a straight line and throw the stick away." This was profoundly elaborated during the sessions to emphasize the need to devote ourselves to growth in the seen and unseen parts of life. We had opportunities to pray together for the convictions gathered for living lives worth the calling we have received.

Thank God for the success of this Summit and pray that the Lord will enable these students to hold firm to Him and His Word as they navigate leadership issues.



Even then, our commitment to discipleship and sharing the truth can only grow stronger.

For the 8th year, we have had chastity campaigns running in the Christian Unions. This season is for the affirmation of the place of pursuing purity in a Christian's life. This year's campaigns are themed towards a *Hope for Restoration* for students who have fallen into sexual sin.
